Counseling News

Principal's Message

We are now through four full weeks of face-to-face instruction. Obviously, there are many positives that have come out of being back for an entire month. One of these is the dramatic improvement in grades. One of the hard parts about virtual learning is simulating the normal classroom environment where teachers can easily check in with students on progress, and support students that are struggling. While this is still possible through digital means, two-way interaction is much more productive with face-to-face instruction. You cannot simulate a perfect classroom experience through a Zoom. In the last month, we have seen a tremendous reduction in failing grades, and this is a direct reflection of teachers and students being able to interact freely.

Another positive is the student response to safety measures and requirements. Students are utilizing the hand sanitizing stations around the school frequently, and mask usage has not been a problem at all. I was a little worried that 13 to 15 year old students would not be able to manage wearing a mask for 7 hours a day, but they have been terrific! They have also been very understanding of social distancing measures and are following procedures and protocols.

With all that being said, we have had, and will continue to face challenges throughout the remainder of the year. While we have only had four positive student Covid-19 cases at the Zemmer Campus, each case potentially results in 40 to 50 quarantines for other students who were possibly exposed. Unfortunately, student quarantines are a necessary measure to prevent an outbreak, which would result in the temporary shutdown of face-to-face instruction. I keep telling students that they will be extremely lucky if they can manage to get through the entire year without having to go into quarantine at least once. For that reason, our quarantine procedure for students is critical to keep them progressing at the same pace as students who are not in quarantine.

My Student is in Quarantine... What Now?

Many of you have already received a call from Zemmer administration in the past four weeks to tell you that your son or daughter needs to be in quarantine. This is not a phone call we like to make, and we know parents like receiving that phone call even less. The good news is we have a plan in place for students who are in quarantine. This is outlined below.

Student Quarantine Responsibility

Please see the document at the end of this newsletter that focuses on what students should do once they are in quarantine. Students will be reviewing it with their teachers in iConnect this week, and will be watching the following video from Dr. Stanton that lays out what to expect when in quarantine.

Students are expected to progress at the same pace as face-to-face students during their quarantine through Google Classroom. Teachers will continue to post assignments, provide resources, and include instructional videos (can include Zooms, Screencastify, EdPuzzle, Khan Academy, etc). If a student is having any difficulty, they should utilize the document at the end of the newsletter to reach out to their teachers for support.

Contact Tracing Procedures

As I said above, there is nothing a parent wants less than a phone call from the principal explaining their child needs to quarantine and cannot attend school for 14 days. I understand firsthand the difficulty and stress quarantines can put on a family. I have had several parents concerned about the contact tracing procedures and how we arrive at quarantine decisions, so I thought I'd lay out that process below. **Close contact, as determined by the health department, is being within 6 feet of a Covid-19 positive individual for 15 consecutive minutes.** The following happens as soon as we receive a positive Covid-19 case.

1. The principal calls the family of the Covid-19 positive student and talks to the parents. This conversation confirms the start of symptoms, the date the Covid-19 test was administered, the date a positive result came back, and the period that student was on campus when they were potentially infectious.
2. The principal interviews the student. This interview reviews all the non-structured times during the school day of the student while they may have exposed students and staff. It determines who the student may have been within close contact of: on district transportation before/after school, on campus before classes started, who they sat with at lunches, and other times (extracurricular or athletics).
3. School administration immediately reviews the student's schedule and the seating charts in the classrooms of that student. From these seating charts, a preliminary list of potentially exposed students is developed.
4. This preliminary list of students is reviewed by each teacher in conjunction with administration. Teachers confirm if this list of students is accurate. If there are questions, we get out the tape measurer and measure desks/seats to determine if the student was in fact in "close contact" as defined above. This of course is done discretely when there are no students in the classroom.
5. If there are still questions, we will often interview students directly. The last thing we want to have happen is to miss a student who should be quarantined. At the same time, we want to make sure we are not quarantining any students who do not need to be.
6. A final report is created and reviewed with the LCS HR Department.
7. The LCS HR Department reviews the investigative report with the Lapeer County Health Department. If the health department determines the report is flawless, they will give us the green light to begin to contact the families of students who need to quarantine.
8. Administration contacts parents to inform them of the quarantine and necessary next steps.

This process is very meticulous, thorough, and takes several hours. We want to make sure we have removed any reasonable doubt, and that any student who may have been exposed is quarantined as outlined in district and health department guidelines. Without this extensive process, we would have to quarantine a greater number of students, and potentially risk a temporary shutdown of the school.

School Picture Retakes

Due to students being in quarantine, we have scheduled a third picture retake day on **November 19th from 12:30pm to 2:00pm**. This would be for both students who did not get their pictures taken during registration and students who are not happy with their pictures taken at registration. For students who do not like their pictures and want retakes, they are to bring in their package of pictures and they can get their retakes free. Picture order forms are available in the office for students who have not yet taken their pictures. We want all students to get pictures taken whether they want pictures or not because we want to include their picture in the yearbook and they will also need a student ID card.



PAC (Parent Advisory Council) Meetings

Each month we hold a PAC meeting at Zemmer. The PAC is different than a PTC in that we focus on academics and other matters that are directly related to the school day, rather than fundraisers or other events. Any parent is welcome to attend. - In order to keep everyone as safe as possible, we will not be conducting our Middle School (6th-8th grade) Winter Sports Parents' Meeting/Meet the Coach Night in person as we have done in the past. Middle School Winter Sports Spectator Covid-19 Safety Information:

- Spectators at events must all wear masks and practice social distancing during events.
- Concessions will not be available at indoor events.
- As of this moment, we are limited to 2 spectators per participant. For middle school events, vouchers will be given to athletes the day before the event and spectators must bring them to the ticket booth the day of the event and pay the \$3 entry.

Middle School Athlete Covid-19 Safety Information:

- Athletes for all Middle School Winter Sports must wear masks at all times during competition and while on the sidelines. Please bring a mask to all practices and games.
- Water will not be provided so bring water to all practices and games.
- Athletes will be screened for Covid-19 symptoms and have a temperature check before every practice and every game.

Middle School Girls Volleyball:

- 8th grade Volleyball practice is every weekday at Zemmer from 5:00-7:00 in the gym. Volleyball players should plan to go home in between school and practice. If there are extenuating circumstances that make this difficult, please contact the Zach Hamilton.
- 8th Grade players should arrive at home games and practices ready to play.
- Our Volleyball home opener is Wednesday, November 4th at Rolland-Warner v. Corunna. 7th Grade starts at 4:45 p.m. and 8th Grade follows at 6:00 p.m.
- At away games, 7th Grade starts at 4:15 p.m. and 8th Grade follows at 5:30 p.m.
- Volleyball COVID 19-related accommodations:
 - o The two-spectator-vouchers-per-participant system will be in effect for all volleyball games this season due to the reduced capacity guidelines set forth by the MHSAA.
 - o Due to the reduced spectator capacity, we will be playing all games on a single court, beginning with 7th Grade Lapeer/Lightning. Each team will play two (2) – 25 point sets in standard rally scoring format.
 - o 7th Grade spectators will be permitted to access the gym at approximately 4:30 p.m. and may remain in the gym for both 7th Grade games (Lapeer & Lightning). At the conclusion of the last 7th Grade set, the gym will be cleared of all 7th Grade players, coaches and spectators. At that time it is recommended that all 7th Grade players and spectators please exit the building.
 - o 8th Grade spectators will not be permitted access to the gym until after it has been cleared of all 7th Grade players, coaches and spectators. It is recommended that 8th Grade spectators do not arrive to Rolland-Warner prior to 5:45 p.m.

- Spectator expectations (time of arrival, "waiting location," etc.) and participant expectations (staying in designated locker room, having to exit gym after game, etc.) will differ from location to location. These will be communicated through the opposing team's AD, through Mr. Cross/Mr. Hamilton and to the volleyball coaching staff each week.
- We will be charging the standard \$3 admission fee at all home Winter 1 sporting events this year. Spectators will need to turn in their voucher at the ticket booth in order to purchase a ticket.

High School Winter Sports Season start dates, times, and locations will be available soon. Our athletic clearance will take place at the LHS athletic office the first two weeks of Nov. Go to Lapeerlightning.com for updated information as it becomes available. For student-athletes to be able to participate in Lapeer High School athletics this year, they need to complete the following list of items below at the LHS athletic office.

- Code of Conduct
- Emergency Medical Form
- 2020/21 MHSAA Health Questionnaire (Used for athletes that have a 2019/20 physical on file)
- Current physical after April 15, 2020 (Used for athletes that DID NOT have a physical during the 2019-20 school year)

Once an athlete has all the proper paperwork turned into the athletic office, the athlete will meet with an administrator and receive their participation bracelet. The bracelet indicates that the athlete has met all of the clearance requirements and can participate in practice/tryouts. Athletes must have their bracelet to participate in practice/tryouts.
