# FOR 8th Grade (next year 9th graders)


Counselors have begun working on the schedule for the 2023-2024 school year for next year's 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students. We start early because this is such a complex process.

Counselors will be visiting 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms during the **week of February 13**<sup>th</sup> to review class options and how to sign up for them. The counselors will also be going to Rolland-Warner on February 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> to meet with 7<sup>th</sup> grade students as well.

All scheduling forms are <u>due by Feb. 27.</u> Students can either enter their own scheduling choices in Powerschool using their form or give them to counselors so they can enter them before this date.

Should you have any questions or concerns about the scheduling process, we have an **Open Enrollment night scheduled for February 23<sup>rd</sup> from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.** You can drop in at any time during this time frame. Counselors will meet with parents as they are available in our Media Center to support and answer any questions you may have.

# **Promoting Positive Behavior at Zemmer**

We work hard at Zemmer to always promote positive behavior. In addition to having clear and consistent rules and expectations, we work closely with parents to ensure there is excellent communication between the school and home. Other programs that promote positive behavior at Zemmer include:

- The Positivity Project Teacher lead lessons that take place every week to promote character strengths within and beyond the school walls.
- The Lightning Leaders A new program where staff recognizes students that excel on a daily basis with excellent behavior and an overall positive influence for all students.
- Positive Behavior Support System (PBIS) Bolt bucks given to students who are caught displaying outstanding hehavior
- LINKS Program A peer support program where we match students up with positive peers who support them throughout the day.

With all that being said, we are still a middle school filled with 13 through 15-year-old students and there are times the choices they make are less than perfect. The administrative staff at Zemmer spends a great deal of time documenting different behaviors that we are seeing and analyzing it for patterns as far as the time of the day, areas of the school it is happening, types of behaviors, and what is causing them. We use a program called SWIS that helps warehouse this information. While we call transgressions "office referrals", we essentially log any time that an administrator needs to speak to a student. This can be for something as simple as running in the hallway, or as serious as being in possession of a vaping device on campus.

Below you will see the current student discipline data for the 2022-2023 school year up to this point. Since we have been doing this for several years, I can tell you that the data looks remarkably similar every year. Once a year I like to share this data with parents. There are several reasons this is beneficial, but two of the main reasons we share are.

- 1. An extremely large percentage of our students (87%) display positive behavior and are making excellent choices throughout the school day (0-1 office referrals)
- 2. To give parents a frame of reference for what is an average amount of discipline issues. On average, we have 4-5 "referrals" a day. Remember, a referral can be something as simple as having a hood on, horsing around, or swearing in the hallway.

# **Student Handbook Notes**

# **Lost or Stolen Cell Phones**

Page 20: The student who brings a cellular phone and/or ECD on school property shall assume responsibility for its care. At no time shall Lapeer Community Schools be responsible for preventing theft, loss or damage to cellular phones and/or ECDs brought onto its property.

Every year we have students who end up misplacing their cell phones. While most of the lost cell phones manage to turn up within a day or so, there are unfortunately times when students will lose a cell phone and it does not turn up. We strongly urge students to make sure they keep property such as cell phones locked away in lockers during the class period, and on their person during unstructured times. On the rare occasion a cellphone is "stolen", it is because the student left it unattended on a table or common area where other students had access to it. In the event a phone is lost, the school is not responsible for replacing the item.

# Zemmer's School Resource Officer

Lapeer Community Schools is very fortunate to have a School Resource Officers (SRO) at every secondary building. At Zemmer, our SRO is Deputy Hunter Salisbury who works as a resource to the school from the Lapeer County Sherriff's Office. Deputy Salisbury will be on maternity leave soon for the remainder of the school year. Stepping into her place will be Deputy Curt June.

What does an SRO do? Primarily she/he provides the school an added layer of safety that we would not have without SRO's. However, they provide the school with much more than that. Other duties of an SRO include...

- Being a positive resource for students. Sometimes Deputy Salisbury and Deputy June
  will serve a role like a counselor and just chat with students who may be having a
  difficult day.
- Providing valuable resources to staff for things like crisis intervention and prevention, tornado/fire plans, school security protocol, and other similar roles.
- Providing training to staff and students about such things like the dangers of drugs and tobacco products.
- General support in the hallways and café. We can never have enough positive role models helping wherever needed.

One thing an SRO does NOT do is take part in the daily rule enforcement and discipline procedures. Unless the behavior falls under "criminal behavior", the Sheriff's Deputies do not take part in dealing with any discipline related issues. Students should go the main office to see the Dean of Students for anything discipline related.



# **PSAT Testing April 12th**

You will be receiving a letter soon in the mail that will introduce the PSAT schedule for 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade students. For all Zemmer students (both 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade) testing will take place on April 12<sup>th</sup>. You will begin to see more information coming out about the PSAT in the coming weeks. With each grade level the students advance to, the standardized testing becomes that much more important. The PSAT testing influences many different areas including:

- · student scheduling
- placement in advanced courses
- early college credits earned (better scores mean more advanced classes leading to more opportunities for dual enrollment)
- preparation for the SAT for college entrance

For our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students, the PSAT is their first experience with a completely different format. Some differences include:

- It is taken with paper and pencil and NOT on the computer (unlike M-STEP)
- The test is **TIMED** so students have to be efficient
- The rules and regulations are much more secure. No cell phones will be allowed in the school on testing day

How can you prepare now?

- Please make sure not to schedule student appointments on April 12th.
- Begin talking to your student about the PSAT

# **After School Tutoring**

If your son or daughter is struggling in any classes, would like help from a certified teacher, or would just like a quiet place to work on missing assignments they should attend our after school tutoring program every Monday and Wednesday from 2:15pm to 3:30pm Students must be provided with their own transportation, but can stay on either day (or both) they choose without signing up. They will just go to the media center after school is over and then be assigned to a teacher based on the content area they want support with. # Half Day for 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Students on April 26<sup>th</sup> for M-STEP Testing

Our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will also participate in the M-STEP for Social Studies and Science. The testing date for this will be April 26<sup>th</sup>. Each test takes about an hour and is taken on the computer. Students should be very familiar with the format of this test as they have been taking M-STEP for the past several years.

Because 9<sup>th</sup> grade students DO NOT TAKE THE M-STEP, they will have a ½ Day of School (do not report until 10:45am) on Wednesday April 26<sup>th</sup>. This allows us to maximize our computers and resources to test ALL 8<sup>th</sup> grade students in one morning without having to do a crazy schedule. All 9<sup>th</sup> grade students will be provided with transportation to school on April 26<sup>th</sup> the buses will just be coming approximately 4 hours later than their normal pick-up time.

We will be sending home more detailed information about this ½ day on April 26<sup>th</sup> for 9<sup>th</sup> grade students over the course of the next two months. For now, 9<sup>th</sup> grade parents should just make sure to mark this date on their calendar as a reminder that students will NOT have school that morning and will report for just the afternoon.
