PAC Meetings (Parent Advisory Council)

The PAC is different than a PTC in that we focus on academics and other matters that are directly related to the school day, rather than fundraisers or other events. Any parent is welcome to attend. After School Tutoring

If your son or daughter is struggling in any classes, would like help from a certified teacher, or would just like a quiet place to work on missing assignments they should attend our after school tutoring program every Monday and Wednesday from 2:15pm to 3:30pm Students must be provided with their own transportation, but can stay on either day (or both) they choose without signing up. They will just go to the media center after school is over and then be assigned to a teacher based on the content area they want

support with.

PSAT Testing April 12th

You should have received a letter in the mail recently containing the PSAT schedule for 8th and 9th grade students. For all Zemmer students (both 8th and 9th grade) testing will take place on April 12th. With each grade level the students advance to, the standardized testing becomes that much more important. The PSAT testing influences many different areas including:

- · student scheduling
- placement in advanced courses
- early college credits earned (better scores mean more advanced classes leading to more opportunities for dual enrollment)
- preparation for the SAT for college entrance

For our 8th grade students, the PSAT is their first experience with a completely different format. Some differences include:

- It is taken with paper and pencil and NOT on the computer (unlike M-STEP)
- The test is **TIMED** so students have to be efficient
- The rules and regulations are much more secure. No cell phones will be allowed in the school on testing day

How can you prepare now?

- Please make sure not to schedule student appointments on April 12th.
- · Begin talking to your student about the PSAT

- Review the practice test at https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/pdf/psat-8-9-practice-test-1.pdf This can help students become familiar with the format of the test

Half Day for 9th Grade Students on April 26th for M-STEP Testing

Our 8th grade students will also participate in the M-STEP for Social Studies and Science. The testing date for this will be April 26th. Each test takes about an hour and is taken on the computer. Students should be very familiar with the format of this test as they have been taking M-STEP for the past several years.

Because 9th grade students DO NOT TAKE THE M-STEP, they will have a ½ Day of School (do not report until 10:45 a.m.) on Wednesday April 26th. This allows us to maximize our computers and resources to test ALL 8th grade students in one morning without having to do a crazy schedule. All 9th grade students will be provided with transportation to school on April 26th the buses will just be coming <u>approximately 4 hours later</u> than their normal pick-up time.

We will be sending home more detailed information about this $\frac{1}{2}$ day on April 26th for 9th grade students over the course of the next two months. For now, 9th grade parents should just make sure to mark this date on their calendar as a reminder that students will NOT have school that morning and will report for just the afternoon.

Dress and Grooming Administrative Guidelines (p.90)

The dress code School Board Policy promotes an environment where "grooming guidelines are necessary to promote discipline, maintain order, secure the safety of students, and provide a healthy environment conducive to academic purposes." There are not specific rules listed in the handbook, and the ultimate determination is up to administration. Some general guidelines are as follows.

- No clothing promoting alcohol, drugs, or tobacco.
- Clothing should not be too revealing. Shorts and shirts should be an appropriate length and underwear should not be showing at any time.
- Hats and hoods are prohibited.

If students are violating the dress code, they may be asked to change clothes or put other clothing over the top of existing clothes. Repeated violations will result in parent contact
