April is a Busy Month

As is usually the case, April is a busy month at Zemmer, mainly due to State testing. Technically, we don't have M-STEP testing until May 1st this year, but preparing students and adjusting schedules is a demanding time for them, as well as for the staff. All the specifics on testing are below.

You have seen some email/text messengers recently regarding bringing charged Chromebooks. This will be extremely important on April 15th (and 16th for those who forget them on the 15th). All students should be sure to bring their Chromebooks with them on Monday, April 15th. They will be turning them into their 1st hour teachers in preparation for the PSAT test on April 17th. This will allow the teachers to make sure they are charged and ready to go, but also gives us an idea ahead of time how many extra Chromebooks are needed. If your student has misplaced their Chromebook, they should notify our Media Center as soon as possible so we can begin the process of locating it or providing a backup to them for testing.

PSAT Testing April 17th



For all Zemmer students (both 8th and 9th grade) testing will take place on **April 17th**. With each grade level the students advance to, the standardized testing becomes that much more important. The PSAT testing influences many different areas including:

- student scheduling
- placement in advanced courses
- early college credits earned (better scores mean more advanced classes leading to more opportunities for dual enrollment)
- preparation for the SAT for college entrance

For our 8th grade students, the PSAT is their first experience with a completely different format. Some differences include:

- The test is TIMED so students have to be efficient
- The rules and regulations are much more secure. No cell phones will be allowed in the school on testing day

How can you prepare now?

- Please make sure not to schedule student appointments on April 17th.
- Begin talking to your student about the PSAT

Half Day for 9th Grade Students on May 1st for M-STEP Testing

Our 8th grade students will also participate in the M-STEP for Social Studies and Science. The testing date for this will be May 1st. Each test takes about an hour and is taken on the computer. Students should be very familiar with the format of this test as they have been taking M-STEP for the past several years. Because 9th grade students DO NOT TAKE THE M-STEP, they will have a ½ Day of School (do not report until 11:00 a.m.) on Wednesday, May 1st. This allows us to maximize our computers and resources to test ALL 8th grade students in one morning without having to do a crazy schedule. All 9th grade students will be provided with transportation to school on April 26th the buses will just be coming approximately 4 hours later than their normal pick-up time.

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Student Handbook Notes

Dress and Grooming Administrative Guidelines (p.90) Find HERE in Secondary Student Handbook

The dress code School Board Policy promotes an environment where "grooming guidelines are necessary to promote discipline, maintain order, secure the safety of students, and provide a healthy environment conducive to academic purposes." There are not specific rules listed in the handbook, and the ultimate determination is up to administration. Some general guidelines are as follows.

- No clothing promoting alcohol, drugs, or tobacco.
- Clothing should not be too revealing. Shorts and shirts should be an appropriate length and underwear should not be showing at any time.
- Hats and hoods are prohibited.

If students are violating the dress code, they may be asked to change clothes or put other clothing over the top of existing clothes. Repeated violations will result in parent contact and potentially discipline.

Sportsmanship

Some general sportsmanship reminders for spectators:

- Remember that you are at a contest to support and yell for your team and to enjoy the skill and competition; not to intimidate or ridicule the other team, its fans, or the referees.
- Remember that school athletics are learning experiences for students and that mistakes are sometimes made. Praise student-athletes in their attempt to improve themselves as students, as athletes and as people as you would praise a student working in the classroom.
- Remember that a ticket to a school athletic event is a privilege to observe the contest, not a license to verbally assault others and be generally obnoxious.
- Learn the rules of the game, so that you may understand and appreciate why certain situations take place.
- Show respect for the opposing players, coaches, spectators and support groups. Treat them as you would treat a guest in your own home.
- Refrain from taunting or making any kind of derogatory remarks to your opponents during the game, especially comments of ethnic, racial or sexual nature.
- Respect the integrity and judgment of game officials. Understand that they
 are doing their best to help promote the student-athlete, and admire their
 willingness to participate in full view of the public.
- Recognize and show appreciation for an outstanding play by either team.
- Use only those cheers that support the teams involved.
- Be a positive behavior role model through your own actions and by censuring those around you at events whose behavior is unbecoming.
